

Obituary

Charles Lewis Hoskins, Jr. was born to the union of Charles and Amanda Hoskins on the 27th day of July 1955, in Greenwood, Mississippi. He was raised in East St. Louis, Illinois, and graduated from East St. Louis Senior High School with a 4.0 grade point average. Charles received and accepted a full academic scholarship from Northwestern University, where he graduated with honors, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science.

Although recruited by many companies and institutions, Charles accepted a position with The Boeing Company in 1977. He was a loyal and valuable staff member at Boeing for 37 years, until deciding to take early retirement in September 2014. He chose to take early retirement in order to spend more time with family and friends, traveling, and enjoying late morning naps.

Charles was lovingly known as "The Rock" and "The Problem Solver", for his entire family. He took much pleasure in taking others on trips, at his expense, to his various timeshare locations. Charles was a man of honor and integrity, who spoke calmly but firmly. You could depend on his word.

Charles was preceded in death by his father, Charles L. Hoskins, Sr., and sisters Priscilla J. Hoskins and Terrelya Denise Hoskins.
